(2) Temporary Family Health Care Dwelling Statute

The State recently passed legislation that requires cities to permit temporary family health care dwelling units. These types of dwelling units have also been referred to as “drop homes, tiny homes, or pod homes”. The legislation includes a provision for cities to opt-out of the law. This would allow the City more time to study the issue and its impact on the City. The Planning Commission held a public hearing on the proposed ordinance on August 10, 2016, and unanimously recommend approval.

MOTION by Erickson, seconded by Cook to pass the following ordinance., All voted in favor. Motion carried.

B. Approve purchase of flag pole for Central Park and City Hall

The flag pole at Central Park can no longer fly flags at half-staff, and no longer can accommodate both the U.S. Flag and the POW/MIA flag. This flag pole was made for residential use not for high winds and/or open space. This request has not gone to the Parks Commission because of a timeline issue. On September 16th, there is the National POW/MIA event being held at Central Park and being able to fly both of the flags is important for this event. Staff is also recommending purchase of a flag for City Hall at the same time in order to receive a discount on both flags and installation.

MOTION by Erickson, seconded by Cook to approve the purchase of a flag pole for Central Park in the amount of \$3,100 to come out of the park dedication fund, and purchase of a flag pole for City Hall in the amount of \$2,725 to come out of the general fund. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

C. Adopt Law Enforcement Services Agreement with the Hennepin County Sheriff's Department
MOTION by Cook, seconded by Holten to approve the Law Enforcement Services Agreement, Contract No. A165597 (a two-year contract with Hennepin County Sheriff's Office), for the providing of law enforcement and traffic law enforcement services for the City. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

D. Line Striping on Vernon Street

Ketcher is requesting \$5,700 to re-paint the lines on Vernon Street following seal coating, as quoted by Sir Lines-A-Lot.


